We use 'there is' and 'there are' to say that something exists.

Singular(Ενικός): there is

Plural(Πληθυντικός): there are

There is a tree in the yard.

There are two cats on the chair.

Contraction (Συναίρεση):

There is a tree. = There's a tree. ~You cannot contract 'There are'

Negative (APNHΣH): There is not a tree in the yard. There are not two cats on the chair.

Negative Contraction: There's not a tree in the yard. There aren't two cats on the chair. There isn't a tree in the yard.

Question (EP Ω TH Σ H): Is there a tree in the yard? Are there two cats on the chair?
